## **CONTRACT SPECIFICATIONS**

#### **6. Description of the contract**

The purpose of the contract is the supply of Stationary and Mobile Portal Monitors and vehicles for Border Control of Nuclear and other Radioactive Materials. The aim of the contract is to provide equipment and training for stationary and mobile portal monitor unit teams, which consist of mobile portal monitor system with automatic detection of nuclear and radioactive materials in vehicles and on pedestrians, installed on the basis of the suitable vehicle, hand held equipment with forensic capabilities and personal radiation detectors (pagers). Mobile portal monitor unit teams are expected to be formed and, using suitable transportation vehicles, move from one border crossing to another in order to detect illicit trafficking of nuclear and other radioactive materials.

## TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

### 8. Eligibility and rules of origin

Participation is open to all legal persons participating either individually or in a grouping (consortium) of tenderers which are established in a Member State of the European Union or in a country or territory of the regions covered and/or authorised by the specific instruments applicable to the programme under which the contract is financed (see item 22 below). All goods supplied under this contract must originate in one or more of these countries. Participation is also open to international organisations. Participation of natural persons is directly governed by the specific instruments applicable to the programme under which the contract is financed.

### 9. Grounds for exclusion

Tenderers must submit a signed declaration, included in the Tender Form for a Supply Contract, to the effect that they are not in any of the situations listed in point 2.3.3 of the *Practical Guide to contracts procedures for EC external actions*.

### 10. Number of tenders

Tenderers may submit only one tender per lot. Tenders for parts of a lot will not be considered. Any tenderer may state in its tender that it would offer a discount in the event that its tender is accepted for more than one lot. Tenderers may not submit a tender for a variant solution in addition to their tender for the supplies required in the tender dossier.

### 11. Tender guarantee

Tenderers must provide a tender guarantee of **12000 € for Lot 1; 2000 € for Lot 2; 2800 € for Lot 3; 1400 € for Lot 4; 600 € for Lot 5** when submitting their tender. This guarantee will be released to unsuccessful tenderers once the tender procedure has been completed and to the successful tenderer(s) upon signature of the contract by all parties. This guarantee will be called upon if the tenderer does not fulfil all obligations stated in its tender.

### 12. Performance guarantee

The successful tenderer will be asked to provide a performance guarantee of 10% of the amount of the contract at the signing of the contract. This guarantee must be provided together with the return of the countersigned contract no later than 30 days after the tenderer receives the contract signed by the Contracting Authority. If the selected tenderer fails to provide such a guarantee within this period, the contract will be void and a new contract may be drawn up and sent to the tenderer which has submitted the next best compliant tender.

### 13. Information meeting and/or site visit

No information meeting is planned.

### 14. Tender validity

Tenders must remain valid for a period of 90 days after the deadline for submission of tenders.

## **15. Period of implementation**

The implementation period will last 180 days starting from the day of issuance of the commencement order and ending on the day of issuance of the provisional acceptance certificate. The implementation period includes a delivery period of 90 days.

## **SELECTION AND AWARD CRITERIA**

### **16. Selection criteria**

The following selection criteria will be applied to tenderers. In the case of tenders submitted by a consortium, these selection criteria will be applied to the consortium as a whole:

1) Economic and financial capacity of tenderer (based on i.a. item 3 of the Tender Form for a Supply Contract)

a) the annual turnover of the tenderer for the year 2007<sup>1</sup> must be at least two times of the submitted financial proposal

b) cash and cash equivalents of tenderer at the end of years 2006 and 2007 are positive

2) Technical capacity of tenderer (based on i.a. items 5 and 6 of the Tender Form for a Supply Contract)

a) the tenderer has successfully completed at least one contract in the field related to this contract (radiation protection) with a budget of at least that of the value of his financial proposal in the years 2005, 2006, 2007 or 2008

An economic operator may, where appropriate and for a particular contract, rely on the capacities of other entities, regardless of the legal nature of the links which it has with them. It must in that case prove to the Contracting Authority that it will have at its disposal the resources necessary for performance of the contract, for example by producing an undertaking on the part of those entities to place those resources at its disposal. Such entities must respect the same rules of eligibility and notably that of nationality, as the economic operator.
